Return to bridge under Covid-19 Restrictions

(to accompany our Covid Safety Plan)

Central Coast Bridge Club is registered as COVID Safe. We have a Covid Safety Plan which abides by NSW Health rules and regulations. This plan is on display in our Clubhouse at all times. These regulations will change over time, and we will adapt any changes to comply with NSW Health. Accordingly, we will keep updating our plan and inform our members as restrictions change. This member information accompanies our Covid Safety Plan. It is aimed to keep you informed on the return to bridge and lessons in our club, to explain the necessary changes we have had to make under NSW Health Regulations and set out guidelines.

Members who play bridge at CCBC, do so at their own discretion. By playing at CCBC, members accept to abide by the guidelines and restrictions we have set down.

HEALTH AND WELL BEING

You must NOT return to the club if any of the following apply:

- You have flu like symptoms
- You have had close contact with someone with flu like symptoms in the last 14 days
- You have returned, or had close contact with someone who has returned from overseas or a "hotspot" area within the last 14 days
- If you are a close contact of a COVID positive person

ENTRY TO THE CLUBHOUSE

- A COVID Monitor will admit you to the Club.
- Entry will only be via the front door. Front door will be opened 30 minutes prior to commencement of session or lesson. Side door will be locked until session is underway, and then no more admissions permitted.
- There will be a table inside the Clubhouse at the entry. Here you will need to use hand sanitiser provided, register your entry via QR reader or login register book. You MUST bring your own pen.
- Please maintain physical distancing while waiting to enter Clubhouse.
- Please arrive early in preparation for a smooth entry and preparation for game

IN THE CLUBHOUSE

- **Please strictly follow instructions of Director,** who is assisted by an appointed Covid Monitor for every session.
- Please maintain physical distancing at all times where practical. Please maintain physical distancing at entry, exit, refreshment station, at noticeboard, locker/bag area and in restrooms.
- Please observe Covid safety signs in Clubhouse
- Upon entry, please proceed to a bridge table and remain seated.
- Please observe limits of people permitted in restrooms at any one time
- Kitchen is CLOSED and off limits
- **Library** is now open. Please use hand sanitiser before handling any books. Returned books to be placed in box provided, and no further handling of returned books.
- A refreshment station is available at front of Clubhouse. An urn with hot water is supplied. Individually wrapped coffee, tea, sugar and milk sachets, as well as biscuit packages are available at refreshment station. Please use sanitiser provided before using urn. We encourage players to bring their own cup/mug.
- Plastic cups are provided at water station, but we encourage members to bring their own water container.
- Please DO NOT bring any food to share.

PLAYING BRIDGE

- Hand sanitiser is provided on every table. Please use it before and after each round of boards, or as frequently as needed.
- EFTPOS machine, money or voucher will be collected at the table. Please have correct money.
- Please use hand sanitiser before using Bridgemate. The Bridgemates are covered in plastic. In a Mitchell movement, only SOUTH player to touch Bridgemate, and verbal acceptance of entry is required by East or West player. In a Howell movement, South player to use hand sanitiser before using Bridgemate.
- Players are to enter their own bid. Please bring your own pen. NO pens will be supplied
- There will be **NO** break for refreshments.
- At end of session, please exit the building promptly, and do not mingle.

At the end of every session, all tables, equipment, and touched surfaces are cleaned according to NSW Health Regulations. Playing cards and boards will be quarantined for 4 days.

NSW Health advises members to download the COVIDSAFE App, and Service NSW QR registration is recommended for contactless entry.
